West End Nature Preserve We're excited to announce the new name for one of Dauphin Island's most cherished areas: The Dauphin Island West End Nature Preserve. This stunning 838-acre area of unspoiled beach, dune, and salt marsh habitats has long been a critical haven for wildlife, including migratory and resident birds, sea turtles, and countless other coastal species. As part of the Mississippi Flyway, the West End provides essential stopover and nesting habitats for birds crossing the Gulf of Mexico. The new name reflects the area's importance as a protected space for both wildlife and visitors to enjoy responsibly. Whether you're a local or a visitor, we invite you to explore the beauty of the West End while helping to preserve it for generations to come. NOTE: The Town has hired beach ambassadors (similar to Park Rangers) that will routinely patrol area beaches and interact with visitors. Informational signage will also be installed throughout the undeveloped portion of the Island's west end to create awareness and identify active nesting areas and critical habitat. Remember dogs are NOT allowed on the West End Nature Preserve.

Bring on the BOOM BOOM! Dauphin Island will get the carnival season rolling when members of the Krewe de la Dauphine toss the first moon pies, beads, and stuffed animals of 2025 on Saturday, February 1 at 1pm! Spectators can expect to see some of their favorite Marvel & DC Heroes (along with a few villains thrown into the mix) as KDLD Saves the World! Serving as Grand Marshal will be Russell Cain and Russell's wife Sherry (she sadly passed away in 2024 and was a Charter Member of KDLD) is being recognized as Honorary Grand Marshal. The parade will roll down Bienville Boulevard from DI Sea Lab to the condos but get here early to grab a good spot along the route. Speaking of which, reserving of space along the parade route is limited to the day-of-event only (post-sunrise) and items such as ropes, ribbons and similar materials are not allowed. Acceptable items include lawn chairs, tents, tables, vehicles, etc. but all such items must be removed at the conclusion of parade or be subject to disposal during cleanup. As always, please only take as much space as you need. The fun continues with the uber popular People's Parade on Saturday, February 8 at 1PM and YOU can be IN the parade! **Billy Goat Hole Update** Renovation of the Billy Goat Hole boat ramps will begin soon. During this time the facility will be closed while contractors work to remove and replace existing ramps and finger piers. The new ramps will be relocated approximately 30 feet further north (away from Bienville Blvd.) to better accommodate launching activities while avoiding routine traffic. These improvements are part of the broader renovation effort that began in 2023 and is a joint project between the Town of Dauphin Island and the ADCNR Marine Resources Division. Our sincere thanks to Governor Kay Ivey for providing the necessary funding through the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) to support this project.

**Bienville Beach Improvements Near** Work on the town-owned Bienville Beach (property north and south of Bienville Blvd. at Pirates Cove Street) will begin soon. The parcels north of Bienville will include a restroom and 40-50 parking spaces while the acreage south of Bienville will see construction of a new boardwalk, decorative fencing, and appropriate signage. Should prove to be another popular public access facility here on the Island!

**Drainage Repair 1200 Block Bienville Blvd.** Drain pipes under the two eastbound lanes of Bienville Blvd. (Just east of the skate park) will be replaced soon and traffic will be rerouted during construction. Motorists are encouraged to drive with caution in this area until repairs are complete.

Let It Snow! Although it was about a month late for Christmas, Mother Nature treated us to an historic phenomenon creating a true Winter Wonderland as more than 7" of powdery white snow blanketed the island. In less than 10 hours we saw an amazing transformation of the traditional Dauphin Island landscape into something resembling what we would normally see in the northern portions of our country. From the shorelines, to the top of the tallest pines, and everything in between, the entire island was completely covered with fluffy snow. A remarkable sight indeed and one for the record books according to local weather officials. That was fun...but let's get back to the balmy temps we're more accustomed to enjoying!

Council Approves Mean High Tide Line The Town Council recently adopted a designated Mean High Tide Line as part of the proposed West End Restoration Project. Now, the Alabama State Lands Division and Alabama Department of Environmental Management will host a public hearing on that same matter on March 6 at 6pm at the DI Community Center. There they will receive comments from the public on the MHTL. In related news, the vote held by the DI Property Owners' Association passed in overwhelming fashion which grants an easement to the town to construct the west end restoration project along portions of West Surf Beach. We appreciate all property owners that took part in this important vote!

Comprehensive Plan The Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee has finalized a community participation questionnaire and SARPC has created a dedicated webpage where you can access it. Public engagement is a crucial part of the comprehensive planning process, ensuring everyone's voice is heard. This collaborative effort is essential for creating a successful plan that accurately reflects the goals and objectives of residents and property owners. The result will be a fact-based plan that outlines the community's future vision, along with identified strategies and recommendations to achieve these goals. Keep an eye out for webpage launch information in early February. The Steering Committee meets weekly on Wednesdays from 6 PM to 8 PM at Town Hall, and we invite you to participate either in person or via Zoom. Please note that meeting dates and times may change, so stay informed and engaged.

Prescribed Burn Preliminary plans are in place for Alabama Forestry staff to conduct a prescribed burn in the Audubon Sanctuary on the east end of the island. Although no specific dates are currently available we anticipate the burns to take place in late January or early February, weather permitting. Prescribed burns are necessary to reduce underbrush (including invasive species) and ground cover that could otherwise fuel a wildfire. The Town has partnered with the Alabama Forestry Commission on this project while town staff and members of the DI Fire & Rescue will be present to monitor conditions.

Food Trucks Are Back! The town council has approved the Food Truck program for 2025 allowing up to two trucks per day (Mondays & Thursdays only) at Cadillac Square. The program will run from March 1-October 31. It's always nice when someone else does the cooking!

Road Work Ahead The east and west bound lanes of Bienville Boulevard (from the 3-way stop to Albright Drive) will soon get new striping. The existing traffic markings have faded over time and will soon receive a fresh coat of paint to enhance visibility during inclement weather and nighttime hours. This should make for safer travels going forward.

Sunset Concerts Return The town is once again contracting with Alabama Coasting to schedule six Sunset Concerts again this year starting in April and running through October. These events are always well attended and offer a variety of music by local and regional talent. A full schedule will be provided in the March Town Crier so be sure to look for that info.

Spring 2025 Bird Banding Event Join the Banding Coalition of the Americas and Dauphin Island Bird Sanctuaries at their annual spring bird banding event in the area across from the Goat Tree Reserve on Cadillac Ave., April 5 & April 9, 8am-2pm daily. Parking and restrooms are located at Cadillac Square 661 Bienville Blvd. Bring a chair as they co-host a family-friendly spring bird banding event on Dauphin Island. Get an up-close experience with birds as they are banded by Federally-licensed banders and safely released. Volunteers will present the birds and information about species and habitat preservation on the island.
