Corps News Dauphin Island Causeway – Placement of dredged material starting soon: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District has partnered with Mobile County to provide material for the Dauphin Island Causeway as part of the Mobile Harbor Deepening and Widening (Phase 6) project. The USACE contractor will place material behind the breakwaters constructed by Mobile County's contractor. Approximately 800,000 cubic yards of dredged material will be placed to create approximately 80 acres of marsh habitat and further protect the Causeway. The USACE construction contract was awarded in May 2024. Construction for the Dauphin Island Causeway part of the project is anticipated to start in March, 2025. Little Dauphin Island 2024 Breach Repair - Complete: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District has completed the repair for the June 2024 breach at Pass Drury. Construction was completed in January, 2025. Sand Island Beneficial Use NW Extension Placement – placement of dredged material starting soon: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District will be beneficially placing sand within the Sand Island Beneficial Use NW extension. Sand will be placed along the ebb-tidal delta shoal system southeast of Pelican Island as part of the Mobile Harbor Deepening and Widening (Project 2a) project. Approximately 2.6 million cubic yards of material will be placed to a maximum elevation of +4 feet. A contract was awarded in August. Construction is anticipated to begin Spring 2025 and is estimated to take approximately 4 months. Little Dauphin Island Restoration: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Mobile District, along with project partners, has developed restoration alternatives of Little Dauphin Island including a permanent breach has started and is being coordinated with restoration activities.

**Bienville Beach Improvements** Work on the town-owned Bienville Beach (property north and south of Bienville Blvd. at Pirates Cove Street) has begun. The parcels north of Bienville will include a restroom and 40-50 parking spaces while the acreage south of Bienville will see construction of a new boardwalk, decorative fencing, and appropriate signage. Should prove to be another popular public access facility here on the Island!

Public Beach Parking Update As we edge ever closer to spring, traffic at our public beaches is expected to dramatically increase. Beachgoers are reminded to use the ParkMobile app to pay for parking fees (\$5 day after Labor Day-March 31 & \$10 April 1-Labor Day) which includes daily access to all three town-owned beaches including East End, Middle, and West End (and soon the new Bienville Beach). Parking is free during the overnight hours. DI Residents & property owners can purchase parking decals (\$5 each) with proper ID while annual passes are available to Non-residents for \$150. Vehicles will be booted and fined for non-payment. For more information please contact town hall.

West End Nourishment Project Public Information Meeting Set The Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the Alabama Department of Environmental Management will be holding a Joint Public Information Meeting to receive comments from those in attendance regarding the Town's application under state law for a beach project permit for the proposed West End project and the associated Mean High Tide Line designation. The meeting will be held on March 6 at 6pm at the DI Community Center. Note: Public comments/statements will only be taken from those individuals attending the meeting in person. However, a Zoom link will be provided so that those unable to attend in person can watch the meeting and ADCNR will provide an email for submission of additional comments after the meeting.

Council Proposes Metal Detecting Ordinance Dauphin Island has a rich history and protecting specific sites and the potential artifacts within are important responsibilities. Although areas in and around historic Fort Gaines and Cadillac Square have long prohibited metal detecting through placement of appropriate signage, an ordinance is now being proposed that will provide an enhanced level of support and enforcement authority by the town. A public hearing is set for Ordinance 109 - An Ordinance Regulating Metal Detecting and Digging In Certain Historical Areas Within the Town of Dauphin Island on March 3 at 430pm at town hall.

Billy Goat Hole Closed For Repairs The Marine Resources Division of the Alabama Department of Natural Resources recently announced the closing of Billy Goat Hole boat ramps as renovation work gets underway. Recognized as the most utilized boat ramp facility in coastal Alabama, the goal is to modernize the facility and extend the ramps and finger piers further north to improve safety during the launching process by avoiding traffic along Bienville Boulevard. This is a continuation of the improvements that began in 2023 which included enhanced parking designs and traffic flow. Upgrades are also planned for the concession/restroom complex such as a new elevator and ADA compliant ramps. The town greatly appreciates the partnership with DCNR to bring these much needed improvements to Billy Goat Hole. Our heartfelt thanks to Governor Kay Ivey and Commissioner Chris Blankenship for their continued support of this and numerous other projects in and around the Dauphin Island community! Note: Construction is expected to take up to 3-4 months to complete.

Stormwater Master Plan Study Underway A comprehensive study is now underway to develop a master plan to better manage stormwater runoff/drainage for the island's east end (approx, East End to Salt Creek). In fact, some of you may have noticed distinct markings on area streets and increased drone activity just in the past few weeks as engineers gather data for the development of GIS maps, geotechnical information, and more. Over the coming 12-18 months, you may also notice increased activity of survey teams in certain neighborhoods as they work to identify short and long-term measures to address problem areas.

Congrats PVT Grace Evermann! You may recall an article in the February Town Crier encouraging residents to purchase and illuminate green lights at their homes in support of island resident Grace Eyermann (and other members of Delta Company 3-39 Infantry) as she participated in a 4-day endurance test commonly known as The Forge. All proceeds from the sale of green bulbs (\$485) were donated to our local DI Veterans Association. The men and women of 3-39 IN are now US Army Soldiers and have officially earned their "Rite of Passage"! Was it difficult? Well here's what a few of them had to say; "It was COLD", "It was the best experience in the world, that I NEVER want to do again", and "Thank God its over". Grace's parents attended the graduation ceremony and shared with them the "The Forge - Light the Island Green" flyer, and it brought tears for many of them or as they would say "I'm not crying, someone's cutting onions". They were truly touched by the kindness and thoughtfulness of a little island that shined green in their honor. On behalf of the Town of Dauphin Island, we appreciate the support of our fellow islanders during The Forge and extend our heartfelt congratulations to Grace Evermann for achieving this impressive milestone!
