Patronas Park Dedication Announced In keeping with the town's initiative to recognize families residing on Dauphin Island during the prebridge era, Patronas Park will be officially dedicated on Friday, April 11 at 5pm and all are invited to attend the ribbon-cutting ceremony. The park, located immediately east of the Pelican Pub on Desoto Avenue, was for many years owned and maintained by the Dauphin Island Park & Beach Board until that organization was incorporated into the Town of Dauphin Island in 2022. Bienville Beach Opening Soon Although it was named Bienville Beach as much as a year or so ago you may not know where it's located. That's due in part that no signage has been installed pending buildout of the site which is located on the north and south sides of Bienville Boulevard near Pirates Cove Street. However, work is now getting underway and you can begin to see the planned improvements including a boardwalk to the Gulf-fronting beach area and a parking lot with restroom facilities on the opposite side of the road. Construction could take 3-6 months to complete.

Artist Opportunity BIG news and LOTS of great changes to the 11th Annual Dauphin Island Art Trail to be held on Oct. 11, 2025! In the past, Art Trail was held at various business locations around the island. This year, it will all be held within the historical Cadillac Square Park set amongst the majestic aging oaks and towering pines. There will still be maps to be stamped for patrons but instead of going from business to business, each categorical area within the park will have a stamping station. In addition to great prizes for the patrons, there will be a \$500 first place, \$200 second place and \$100 third place awards for selected juried artists. Steiner Reserve Dedication Dauphin Island Bird Sanctuaries (DIBS) announces a public dedication for the STEINER RESERVE, Monday, APRIL 21st, 5-630pm at the Goat Tree Reserve on the corner of Grant St. & Cadillac Ave. DIBS will celebrate this momentous accomplishment with those that helped make it possible including the Town of Dauphin Island, our supportive community and others. There will also be an acknowledgment of the contributions of the Boni family in memory of Thelma Boni and the Goecker family in memory of Revalee Goecker. Admission is free.

Warblers & Wine The Dauphin Island Chamber of Commerce and Dauphin Island Bird Sanctuaries (DIBS) will co-host "WARBLERS & WINE" from 5-630PM at the Welcome Center on APRIL 7. Chamber members will be there as well as the birders and the BCA bird banders to answer any bird related questions. The public is invited and light refreshments will be served. Admission is free.

Mowing Suspended: It's "For the Birds"! Mowing grass & native wildflowers eliminates a vital food source that arriving migrant birds have depended on for thousands of years. The Town of Dauphin Island in partnership with the Dauphin Island Bird Sanctuaries (DIBS) are implementing the "We're All About The Birds" project and here's what it means. Mowing will be suspended along certain streets on the island to allow native wildflowers to grow and provide that essential source of foods for these migrants after their 600 mile non-stop journey across the Gulf. Streets with the project areas include Forney Johnston (South of Bienville) east to Audubon and South to Admiral Semmes, the east side of Grant Street,. Cadillac Ave. east of the Shell Mounds, all sides of the Steiner Reserve and the north shoulder of Fort Charlotte. In addition to these streets, many front lawns will also go without mowing as it contains one of the most sought after plants by visiting birds such as Indigo & Painted Buntings and other migrants: Lyreleaf Sage. Mowers are scheduled to return to these ares early May but homeowners are free to mow in front of their residences if they prefer not to participate OR they can go a step further, and NOT mow their own yards! If a homeowner is interested in participating, a member off DIBS will be glad to come out and check your yard for these plants. Look for the many "No Mow" signs around the island. Call 861-BIRD (2473) for further information.

It's Spring Clean-up Time! The annual signs of spring are popping up all around us and it's the perfect time of year to freshen up around our homes and properties. Little things like yard maintenance or disposing of trash and debris that routinely accumulates in our lives can make for a relatively easy facelift. The town continues to offer free dumpster use to island property owners (Fridays & Saturdays 8am-noon) and will provide use of a trailer to transport non-household debris in certain circumstances. Let's all do our part to keep Dauphin Island looking good!

Public Beach Parking Update As we edge into spring, traffic at our public beaches is expected to dramatically increase. Beachgoers are reminded to use the ParkMobile app to pay for parking fees (\$5 day after Labor Day-March 31 & \$10 April 1-Labor Day) which includes daily access to all three town-owned beaches including East End, Middle, and West End (and soon the new Bienville Beach). Parking is free during the overnight hours. DI Residents & property owners can purchase parking decals (\$5 each) with proper ID while annual passes are available to Non-residents for \$150. Vehicles will be booted and fined for non-payment. For more information please contact town hall.

DI Fire Department The fire department is always looking for able-bodied individuals to become members of our volunteer fire department. We have a business meeting on the third Monday of the month at the fire station at 7pm and also hold training sessions on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month. This month is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke detector and remember to pay attention to reputable stations like local news channels and NWS for weather alerts and forecasts. Town Hosting Building Code Forum Proposed Building code changes for Dauphin Island will be front and center when town officials and agency representatives gather at the DI Community Center on Tuesday, June 24 at 5pm. Representatives with Smart Homes, Fortified Homes Inspectors, and Building Officials will be on hand to discuss code changes (2018 to 2024 versions), including trades. Code upgrades will help our ISO ratings which in turn help reduce insurance rates for island property owners. Make plans NOW to attend and watch for additional details as the event draws near.
